#### 7. Approval of High School Out of State and Country Student Trips

Refunding Bonds, dated 4/1/2022, on June 26, 2023, with the funds of the District on hand. Malchetske/Bartol moved to approve option #1, reducing three routes. Roll Call vote: Bartol-yes, Malchetske-yes, Podoll-yes, Gehrke-yes, Toney-yes, Krause-yes, Burgess-no, Shattuck-yes, Kujawa-yes. Motion passed.
