A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear BHS Families. I hope you all had a relaxing and enjoyable holiday. While we are starting a brand new year, we are also closing out our first semester of the school year on January 13. We have nine days for students to wrap up any outstanding work, so encourage your child to make a strong final push. Staff will be finalizing grades during their work day on January 16th, and report cards will be available by the 23rd. Information about accessing report cards can be found in this newsletter. New classes will begin on Tuesday, January 17th.

In addition to starting the new semester, we will be starting the process of registering for classes for the 2023-24 school year this month. We will be meeting with each class to share information about the registration process and the course offerings available to them. Our 2023-24 course handbook will be available for viewing on our website on or before the 18th of January (BHS>Students and families>Handbooks). Please feel free to reach out to your child's counselor with any questions about your child's courses or track in high school (Last name A-L is Ann Ragus, Last name M-Z is Matt Willett).

The beginning of the new year and new semester is also a good time to refresh on some important procedural items:

- If your child is too sick to attend school, please notify the school of this by calling and leaving a message on the attendance line. These absences are coded differently and do not accrue towards truancy in the same way as when a student is absent without an explanation.
- Excessive tardiness (to school or between classes) can result in

- truancy or other school consequences. It is important to on time for learning and as a life skill.
- Students should be out of the building by 3:30 p.m. unless involved with a supervised extracurricular activity or arrangements have been made with a teacher.
- Students should be bringing their charged Chromebook to school every day. It is an essential part of their learning 'toolbox'.

It is hard to believe, but the end is near for our seniors. There is important information in this newsletter regarding dates and things to be thinking about that pertain to our seniors. Please check that out, especially the scholarship information and deadlines.

The last thing I wanted to mention is that we are starting to enter our state testing season. Our Juniors will be taking the ACT exam on March 7th, and our freshmen and sophomores will be taking the PreACT in April. We will be advertising some optional ACT prep sessions for our juniors starting this month that will help them understand the format of the test as well as some tips and strategies to be successful on the test. Students interested in this opportunity should listen to announcements or stop into student services for more information. Opportunities for additional prep activities for underclassmen will come in

NURSE UPDATE

I hope everyone enjoyed their time away from school and had a wonderful time with their families! It is that time of year, unfortunately, where people are becoming ill. There are colds, flu, COVID, strep throat, RSV and many other illnesses out there. Please remind your children of the importance of washing their hands to decrease their risk of becoming ill. Remind them not to share food and drinks with friends and try to encourage them to keep their hands away from their faces as that is one of the most common ways viruses enter our bodies. Please do your best to follow the "stay-at-home" health guidelines to keep others at school from becoming ill. If you have questions please feel free to contact me via email of phone at 920-361-2442 ext 2129 and I will get back to you as soon as I can.

BASD "Stay-at-Home" Health Guidelines Your child should stay home when they:

- 1. Have an Oral temperature that is higher than 100.3° F. They must be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school. If fever reducing medications have been used, like Acetaminophen (Tylenol) or Ibuprofen (Motrin), this does not count as being fever free.
- 2. Have a fever or other symptoms caused by COVID-19 without a negative test. Your child must stay home for 5 days from the first day COVID symptoms appeared. Your child must be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications and symptoms improving before you can return to school.
- 3. Are positive for COVID-19 and have no symptoms, then you must stay home for 5 days from the day the test was done.
- 4. Have diarrhea or vomiting. You should be vomit and/or diarrhea free with a normal temperature for 24 hours before returning to school.
- 5. Have coughing and/or wheezing that are not related to COVID-19 but are causing difficulty breathing or moderate chest pain.
- 6. Have an undiagnosed rash or open sores with drainage.
- 7. Have abdominal pain that is accompanied by fever, diarrhea, and/or vomiting
- 8. Have a sore throat serious enough to interfere with swallowing or is accompanied by a fever or rash.
- 9. Have "pink eye" and drainage is present and/or have discomfort/itching that interferes with activities. You may return after 24 hours of antibiotics if they are ordered by a physician.
- 10. Have any infectious bacterial infection. You may return once fever free, symptoms are improving, and you have been on antibiotics for 24 hours.

PASS SURVEY

With a continued commitment to addressing social and emotional barriers to learning, we are asking all students enrolled in the Berlin Area School District to complete the Pupil Attitudes to Self and School (PASS) survey. The PASS Survey was developed by a team of educational psychologists from multiple universities to provide highly reliable and valid information into how students feel about themselves as learners and how they feel about school. Available in twenty languages, PASS allows schools to detect possible barriers to student learning. including issues around confidence, resilience, motivation, and concentration. The PASS survey will allow our district to proactively address non-academic barriers to learning, which can compromise our students' well-being and academic success. The survey will be administered in late January, to <u>OPT OUT</u> of the survey, please email Ann Schnyder, Director of Pupil
