Our staff at Clay Lamberton do an amazing job analyzing each student's learning style(s) and differentiating the curriculum and instructional format to meet these needs head-on, allowing all students to be highly successful. As a building, we have developed systems and supports to meet an individual's needs with or without a disability. This summer, Clay Lamberton will once again be holding summer school for students currently in grades 4K through 4th. Summer school will run from June 12 - June 29, Monday through Thursday from 8-11:30. Breakfast and lunch will be included with this program. BASD is partnering with the Boys & Girls Club to provide wraparound care immediately following summer school, transportation will be provided to the Club each day. Registration is NOW OPEN for Club activities, check out their website to learn more. Fees may apply; scholarships are always available.

In addition to typical academic activities such as reading and math, students will also be able to choose from two of the following activities.

- Survivor students will learn how to make a shelter, learn basic first aid, and find out what to do if they get lost among many other important survival skills.
- Cooking A discovery-based hands-on course that will provide students with the opportunity to learn about cooking! Students will make snacks and desserts that require little to no baking.
- Art Adventures Students will learn about different artists from around the world of the past and present all while creating projects using the elements of art and design.
- American Sign Language Students will learn some basic sign language while playing games, learning songs, and engaging in fun activities.
- Fun and Games Students will start off learning and playing traditional games such as Jenga and Sorry and move onto more complicated games such as UNO and War and even have the opportunity to create their own games.
- Outdoor Sports Students will participate in team sports in the (hopefully) beautiful summer weather. Games will include soccer, kickball, football, and baseball/softball.
- Physical Education Summer PE will be an extension and further practice of the physical skills students learned during the year.

If you would like your child to be entered into the all-day 4K lottery, you must register your child no later than **April 21st at 4 pm** in the Clay office. To be considered for the full-day lottery, a completed registration is required, which includes your child's birth certificate, proof of residency, and immunization records.
