A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear BHS Families,

December is a busy and exciting time both in and out of school. Besides the holiday 'buzz' and changes in weather, December also brings music concerts, new sports seasons, and our last good stretch of academics before we get to the end of the semester (January 12th). We have a staff development day on December 11th. I'd like to share a little more about what we are working on during these staff development days.

The State of Wisconsin provides academic standards for every subject. These standards serve as a guide for what students should know and be able to do by a certain grade. These standards often are complex and full of high-level tasks for students. There are also often more standards than can be covered in a year. As a result, schools have to make decisions as to what is most important and which standards to prioritize and spend the most time on. The dissection and prioritization of standards takes time, but is necessary to bring clarity to the learning process. To be efficient, the teacher and student must both know what the expected outcomes are of a lesson or a unit, and all activities should be in tune with that end goal. Furthermore, the assessments (tests/assignments) must be true measures of those outcomes and be in alignment with the standards.

Our staff has been spending these professional development days mapping out standards and ensuring that the assessments we are giving actually measure a student's ability to do what is asked in the standards. Having common assessments between classes will also allow us to have more productive conversations about student progress and what adjustments need to be made when a student shows they know it or shows that they don't. We are making progress, but the work is continuing. The professional development days we have are necessary for this work to happen and I am confident that the work we are doing will make us a better school.

I want to wish you and yours a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. I hope you find this holiday season to be full of joy and happiness.


BHS Instructor Presents at State Conference





BHS Students Submit Entries for State Art Show

The Wisconsin Association of School Boards, in cooperation with the Wisconsin Art Education Association and Performance Services, announces the annual Wisconsin Art Exhibits and Awards. This experience is open to all Wisconsin public school students enrolled in grades 7-12. The theme for this year's show is Art that Inspires.



BHS Senior Mataya Raisleger is submitting her work, Sweet Dreams. This is an acrylic piece over stretched canvas. Here is more from the artist: "My painting is based on a dream that I frequently have: I'm in an art gallery, following someone who seemed to be a special person to me, who could also be perceived as the dream itself in the painting. All the paintings in the gallery were covered, which to me symbolizes the unknown future, which is often a fear of mine. I remember there being one painting that was uncovered, but I don't remember what it was. I decided to make the uncovered painting look like a window that could take me back to reality or wake me up from my dream. And to give it one extra hint of being dreamlike, I added wings on my back because I fly a lot in my dreams. The mood I hope to convey is a calm, pensive, Deja vu/nostalgia. I think people could also relate to not wanting to wake up from dreams, which is the main idea in this painting."

Melanie Resop, BHS Junior, also is submitting her acrylic drawing on stretched Canvas. Here is Melanie reflecting on her work, Judge Her Beauty: "My work shows a teary-eyed girl who has nothing on her face and she's almost looking into a mirror and is seeing these different versions of herself. One version has a lot of contour, blush, and concealer. Another has mascara running and smeared lipstick. And one has a puffy face with tears and she's pulling at her cheek and she has chipped nail polish. Judgmental eyes surround the girl. I want to communicate being afraid of judgment that stems from beauty standards. A fear of being herself because she won't be fitting anyone else's image. I hope to convey a mood of worry and sadness. To show anxious feelings about everyone's eyes being on you."
