A Message from the Principal

Greetings BHS Families-

Next week is Teacher Appreciation Week. My mother taught first grade in the Oshkosh School District for over 30 years and my father was a special education and physical education teacher for nearly 30 years right here in Berlin. Growing up with teachers as parents, they taught me a lot about education and even more about life.

The best teachers connect with their students and build relationships. Just last year, my mom received a call from a former student (now in her 40's), letting her know what an impact she had on her life. As educators, we care about your child and hope that we make a lasting impact.

Educators are selfless. They put in an enormous amount of time to provide the best opportunities for their students. My dad coached for the majority of his teaching career. He gave up time at home with his family in all three seasons to take long bus rides and stand in inclement weather. 












Microsoft Office Students Hear From Formal Businesses



It was a great time had by all!














Your Child's Safety is our #1 Priority
